EDUCATION COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND EXTENSION

Sustaining its functional linkages with 35 various government, non-government, and private organizations in 22, the Mountain Province State Polytechnic College implemented educational outreach activities with its community partners. A total of 35 extension and outreach activities were implemented and completed in 2022. From these activities, education-related community outreach activities were included: Skills Enhancement on Creating Instructional Videos, Training Workshop on Power Point Presentation, Training on Basic Sign Language, Seminar Workshop on Action Research, among others.



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The well-structured and approved education-related extension programs of the College, specifically the programs titles “Live and Share Learnings (Ifiyag ya ifingay nan sus-ulo) Extension Program” and the “Teachers on the Hill Extension Program” of the Teacher Education departments of both campuses were sustained in 2022. In fact, the extension project of the Bontoc campus titled, “Og-ogfo: Unveiling the transformative impact of a teacher education extension project for sustainability and wider community replication” was conferred by the Agricultural Training Institute as 2nd Best Extension Project in the Cordillera region.



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
